

ALAN BEATTIE HERRIOT



As well as being one of Scotland's most successful figurative sculptors (he made the monumental sculpture of Robert the Bruce outside Marischal College in Aberdeen) Alan Herriot also trained as an artist. He sculpted the gilt hilt of The

Elizabeth, the ceremonial sword presented to King Charles III at Holyrood on his Coronation. Responsible for a number of lifesize sculptures around Scotland he is currently involved in work with Swindon Town FC, Edinburgh Castle's Scots Grey Dragoon Guards Museum and a commission for the World War II Commando training camp at Achnacarry.





CAPTAIN ROBERT FALCON SCOTT CVO (1868-1912)



Sepia toned carbon print of Captain Scott of the Antarctic writing his journal in his Hut at Cape Evans, photo taken by Herbert Ponting on 7 October 1911.

Scott is pictured holding one of his favourite pipes, with an array of pipes on the left wall. Labels verso state the print was framed in New Zealand and exhibited in the New Zealand & South Seas International Exhibition in Dunedin 1925-1926. It retains the original simulated wood mount 35 x 44



Captain Scott's own pipe which was retrieved from his failed expedition in 1912. This pipe was obviously one of Scott's favourites as it has been well used with the mouthpiece bitten and bowl worn. It has always been assumed that it was found with Scott's body and perhaps witnessed his last mortal breath but further research is required to verify this.

Captain Scott's story is one of heroic failure. These were his final moments:

On March 19 1912, Scott himself, Wilson and Evans made their final camp, approximately 12.5 miles short of One Ton Depot. During the next nine days, with progress impossible and their supplies running out, and with storms and -40C temperatures still raging outside the tent, Scott and his companions wrote their farewell letters. Scott wrote his final entry on 29 March, with the concluding words: "Last entry. For God's sake look after our people". Scott is presumed to have died on 29 March 1912. The positions of the bodies in the tent when it was discovered eight months later suggested that Scott was the last of the three to die. The bodies were discovered by a search party on 12 November 1912. Trygve Gran, who was part of the search party, described the scene as "snowcovered til up above the door, with Scott in the middle, half out of his bagg ... the frost had made the skin yellow & transparent & I've never seen anything worse in my life." Their final camp became their tomb; their records and personal belongings were retrieved before the tent roof was lowered over the bodies and a high cairn of snow was erected over it, topped by a roughly fashioned cross, erected using Gran's skis. The items were returned to Scott's widow, Kathleen Scott, where they remained in the family.

A number of institutions have relics and personal belongings from the expedition. Scott's snow shoes, sledging goggles and the book bag for his diary are held in the National Maritime Museum, Greenwich. The Museum of Oxford contains among other items a marmalade tin gifted to Scott by an Oxford businessman which was recovered from the site of his death. The Museum of Timekeeping at Upton Hall, Nottinghamshire, has the pocket watch which was found with his body. Scott's sledging flag is held in Exeter Cathedral.

This is a rare opportunity to obtain a relic of living history, an item extremely poignant of a bygone age of heroic exploration and which, if it could speak, could tell a story of unimaginable suffering and heroism.







Augustus was the son of the Duke of Sussex and Lady Augusta Murray, grandson of George III and nephew of George IV and William IV. His parents secretly married in Rome but this was annulled making Augustus illegitimate under English law. He rose to Colonel in the Army and was deputy ranger of St James's Park and Hyde Park, also an active member of the Aborigines Protection Society. He is the earliest recorded person for whom a definite diagnosis of multiple sclerosis can be made. This larger than lifesize portrait has descended through the Murray family.


